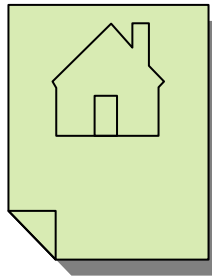

Housing Affordability

Balancing community concerns and the need for a range of housing choices is a challenge as the Capital Region of BC is one of the most expensive housing markets in Canada. Access to affordable housing is essential for building strong communities. A range of housing options and costs available can then contribute to a strong regional economy. Those with limited incomes need decent rental accommodations, as do those households with moderate incomes that rely on the open real estate market.
